RULE OF THIRDS

Photographers:

- Mentally divide your photo into thirds (both vertically and horizontally)
- Create an interesting photo by placing the subject of your photo at one of the lines marking one third of the photo
- Create an interesting photo by placing the focal point of your photo at the intersecting points of the lines dividing your photo into thirds

The **focal point** is the part of the photo that makes your photo unique and interesting; it is where your eye should be drawn to when viewing your photo









Tips for Mastery:

- Look for leading lines in your photo that lead directly to an intersecting point of the lines dividing your photo into thirds
- Take a photo with 2 focal points, each on a line marking one third of the photo
- Try your horizon line at the top third of the photo and the bottom third of the photo— think about which works better for your subject
