## My 4-H Story

### Hailey Domke (4-H Friends 4-H Club)

Hi, my name is Hailey Domke, and this is my 8<sup>th</sup> year serving as a 4-H member and I just finished 7<sup>th</sup> grade. This will be my 4<sup>th</sup> year as a 4-H exhibitor but my 8<sup>th</sup> year all together showing at the fair. This year I was able to explore a lot of different things to see what I wanted to be involved in. I have said this every year but this year I truly feel that this year in 4-H was my best one yet and I cannot wait to see what else I have coming. Nobody's fair experience could have compared to the year I have had from training 12 cows to show, training 2 pigs, and working on my 9 expo categories I had entered in that ranged from 5-25 projects entered into that category the fair.

To start the year off, my club voted to keep the same officers as last year, so I severed my 2<sup>nd</sup> year as being the Secretary of 4-H Friends 4-H Club and eventually hope to be the president. It is an honor that I am able to take on so many responsibilities by just being the Secretary of our 4-H Club. I was able to show up to almost every meeting and only missed 1 or 2. Throughout the year I was able to accomplish many goals, like to know everyone's name, improve my speaking skills, improve my writing skills, and learn how to record all the necessary and basic information I need to write down. Through my club I was able to arrange working with some people to donate a bunch of food to a food pantry and was also able to make 500 cards along with buy 100 word books for Parkview nursing home. I am very proud of what I have done through my position and glad to end the year knowing that I did well, and I made a difference in the club.

My 4-H year was awesome and one thing besides being secretary in my club that made the year awesome was that I did a demonstration on showing cows at our June meeting at the Ewald Farm. I used my Milking Shorthorn Grade Spring Calf that I showed at the fair, Lassie, and showed them how to walk her some things I do to train her, and I also let them pet her. It was a successful demonstration.

I was able to participate in walking 5 parades with the Winnebago County Fairest of the fair Jodie Wyland, the runner up fairest Eden Chapin, and the Winnebago County fair board. It is such a cool experience to be able to promote the fair and see everyone so excited for the fair. I participated in the Neenah Menasha light show, Oshkosh parade, Omro parade, Eldorado parade along with Golden oak 4-H club and Winneconne parade.

I also am apart of 4-H Ambassadors, and YAC where I enjoy planning and promoting many different things throughout 4-H. Through YAC I had an awesome opportunity to help create the Officer training breakout rooms and do a presentation on showing Dairy to educate younger youth. Not only am I a part of them I also got nominated to be on the 4-H Leaders board, accepted it, and got voted on. I loved having the opportunity to be on the 4-H Leaders board and be able to have a say in things along with seeing the behind the scenes of everything.

This year I was able to participate in the 4-H Dairy Judging contest in Jefferson County and placed 5/70 juniors and was able to go to state and unfortunately didn't place in the top 10.

In March I was able to participate in the Wisconsin Guernsey Breeders association and participated in many things.

Every year before the fair my family shows our registered color breed cows at the Northeast Wisconsin High Protein Show in Seymour, WI and I took a 3 year old Guernsey Milk cow, Blue Dreams Cordell **Sophie** and placed 2<sup>nd</sup> blue, received top production award and junior reserve champion cow. I also took a Guernsey Summer yearling, Domke Novak Olaf **Sven** and placed 1<sup>st</sup> blue and 2<sup>nd</sup> blue. For showmanship I used a Guernsey Spring yearling, Domke Novak Forrest **Aspen** and placed 3/14 and got 3<sup>rd</sup> blue.

This year I took on a new challenge to show 2 pigs and raise 2 pigs for meat and had a great learning experience and was able to attend many 4-H educational swine presentations. To help raise money to show my pigs I signed up for the Wisconsin Pork Association Scholarship and received it and got \$50 to go towards my swine project to help pay for everything. I bought my pigs from my moms friend down in Oregon, Wisconsin and they had helped me a lot with everything this year. I worked really hard to get my pigs to meet weight and they did. I made sure my pigs got exercise daily and kept them as clean as possible.

On Tuesday when I brought my pigs in Oreo my cross bred pig weighed 285 lbs. and my pig Kentucky, she is a Duroc, and she weighed 249 lbs. I was so happy that my pigs weighed in at the exact weighed I wanted them to. On Friday when I showed my pigs I got 4<sup>th</sup> place ribbon with Kentucky, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbon with Oreo. I took Oreo back in for showmanship and she was not happy, she was running around trying to go back to her pen and jump around because she was tired and hungry but I did get a 2<sup>nd</sup> place ribbon. Although I thought that I should have done better I was proud of myself because it was only my first year showing pigs and everyone else has been showing for a lot longer than me. On Saturday morning I participated in the Meat Animal sale. I was really nervous that I wouldn't get people to bid on my pig, but I could not stop smiling when they announced my name and all I saw was everyone's signs going up. It meant so much more when I was told that so many people were bidding on my pig that they couldn't even announce everyone. I was too busy trying to keep Oreo walking and thinking about how many people were bidding on my pig that when I walked out of the show ring the first thing I said was "WHO BOUGHT MY PIG!" when I was told that a couple of the fair board members had worked together to buy my pig, I was so happy. That day my pig had sold for \$6.50 and Curvy Hill farm (Brooke and Ryan Overton), Selle Farms (Jim Selle), and Golden Tamarack Acres (Matt and Rachel Neuman). This year I received 2<sup>nd</sup> place herdsmanship for swine.


By taking the experience of showing swine this year I was able to learn how to use my money right and I was also able to learn about financial stuff. In 2020 I worked a summer job at a strawberry patch to help make enough money to have to put towards things I would like to do, and the rest will be saved for college. With the money I saved I put towards buying my pigs for this year and it had helped out a lot.

This year I also took the challenge of showing 12 cows which I am pretty proud of myself on how I did. In showmanship I showed my Grade Holstein Winter Yearling Milkshake and won the class, the judge said he had a really hard time that's why he kept switching 2 other girls and me. One thing I wish the judge did was ask everyone questions because you might have someone who can walk an animal in the show ring, but they might not be able to tell you all about that animal. Many people touch there animal once and have someone else do all the work and that wrong. At least I know that I left that show ring after putting all of my own effort into her and only got just a little help clipping her legs and I am really proud of that. Out of all 12 cows I showed I brought home 6 trophies' not including our clubs 1<sup>st</sup> place barn award trophy. I got Overall Grand Champion Ayrshire with my winter calf, Flour, overall grand champion Milking Shorthorn with my summer yearling, Kopper, Overall Grand Champion Guernsey with my summer yearling, Sven, Overall Reserve champion with my spring calf, Lassie, Grade reserve champion Jersey with my summer yearling, Shelly and Intermediate 1<sup>st</sup> overall trophy with my Grade winter yearling Holstein, Milkshake.

On Friday night I was able to participate in the Winnebago County Futurity Show. I took in Lassie, my Milking Shorthorn spring calf. The futurity show is something I also look forward to because I am able to do my calves fitting any way I want, I get to dress up, and I get to show in another show. I decided to take Lassie in because she walks well, and I knew that she would compete. It's always interesting watching the Futurity show because when you have all the breeds competing you would think Holsteins would automatically beat out colored breeds but that doesn't always happen.

Unfortunately, this year I was unable to help in the dipper between doing swine and dairy barn duty, showing animals and helping others out. Which is one thing I am planning on doing next year.

Through 4-H I am able to make so many new friends that don't go to my school and that aren't in the same grade as me. Its an honor to be able to show at the fair and have so many opportunities by doing what I do. By far fair is my favorite part, learning new skills, meeting new people even if they aren't in 4-H or if they aren't in my club, and lastly fair is by far my favorite part of my 4-H year because I am able to take baby steps to get to where I am from the beginning to the end of my 4-H year, and it is so cool to see what I have accomplished. I can't wait to see what 4-H has to come for me in the future.
