



Winnebago County 2020-2021

The 4-H Thriving Model predicts that youth who participate in 4-H programs that provide a high-quality developmental context will thrive, and thriving youth achieve key developmental outcomes.

To determine scores, youth members age 13 and up were invited to take an online survey asking them questions about their 4-H experience. The survey was developed by Mary Arnold, Oregon State University and Ryan Gagnon, Clemson University. Wisconsin served as a pilot state for administering the survey in 2020 & 2021.

After analyzing data, the scores are provided which assess each component of the model on a scale of 1-7, 7 meaning outstanding program quality. A score of 5 or higher is an indicator of high-quality programming.
