

4-H Key Award & Scholarship Applications

4-H Key Award is the highest 4-H recognition you can receive. 4-H Key Award applicants must have consistent 4-H growth, be a 4-H youth in 9th grade or older, must have completed at least 3 years of 4-H and 1 year of youth leadership and contributed to service to their club, community, and county.

The Winnebago County 4-H Leaders' Association awards up to five \$500 scholarships to current 4-H members who are high school seniors. This includes one scholarship from the Judith Gruszynske Memorial (Oshkosh Area Community Foundation), one scholarship from the Simpson Memorial, one from the Stevenson Memorial, and two from the Winnebago County 4-H Leaders' Association.

The Key Award and Academic Scholarships (for post-high school education) are a combined application. Youth can apply for just one or both, depending on their eligibility.



Excess funds can cause a 4-H club or group to unintentionally become a private foundation as defined by the IRS. All non-profits have guidelines related to excess funds. UW Extension, Division of Madison has defined excess 4-H funds as a 4-H club or group's monies that exceed two years of expenses, or \$2,000, whichever is greater and they require these clubs/groups to create a five- year spend down plan.

Currently, the Winnebago County 4-H Leader's Association has \$53,775.00 in excess funds and a five-year plan must be developed.

We Need and Value Your Ideas! These excess funds were raised by you, our volunteers! Therefore, we need your ideas on how to best utilize these funds to support our existing clubs and projects, as well as county-wide and state-wide event opportunities for our youth. We also need to look at ways to grow our current youth membership numbers.

Share Your Ideas at the January All-County Meeting! We hope that this extremely important meeting will be highly attended by our volunteers! Please come to the meeting prepared with some ideas on how these funds can be used. Ask yourself:
