



Week 1

Our students are so excited about learning the life cycle of a chick.

They loved learning about the incubator and how it works



Week 2

Our students enjoyed getting their t-shirts. They loved learning about the parts of an egg. They also love having eggs in the incubator.





Week 3

Today we measured the length and circumference of an egg, the volume of an egg and the weight of the egg. We checked on our eggs and used a special light to see how our chicks were doing.



On our last meeting, we did some different experiments with eggs as we eagerly await our chicks hatching. We saw what vinegar does to eggs as well as what happens with hot water and eggs. We also got to use some magnifying glasses to help us with the eggs as well.



On week 5, we built an egg catcher. All of our eggs passed the test and did not break. We are awaiting the birth of our chicks!!!





Today we learned about careers in agriculture and working with chickens. We learned about other animals and how they relate to chickens.

Week 1

The students have been responsible for checking the incubator daily and adding water to keep the humidity level constant. They

constant. They record the temperature and check for egg rotation. They are keeping their eye on a speckled egg and have made predictions that chick might be slightly different in color.



Week 2

Eggs were set in the incubator this week and students learned about the parts of an egg.

Week 3

We saw the insides of the egg by a process called candling. It was determined that we have many viable eggs!

Our Classroom Journey Through the Life Cycle of a Chicken

Week 1

Today our class begins our ChickQuest journey. We used hygrometers to locate the best place to set our incubator. We

incubator. We talked about why the eggs like the hot, humid conditions and we also received our booklets and learned about 4-H and about the programs that are offered through 4-H.



Week 2

The class was thrilled to receive a dozen fertilized eggs today. After each egg was carefully marked and placed

safely in the incubator, we studied the inside of an unfertilized egg by cracking open eggs and then studying them closely. We were amazed to see and learn about all the different parts of an egg.



Week 3

It was an exciting day as the class got to see firsthand the development of the embryo through a process called candling. You could hear the amazement as they witnessed the tiny chick starting to move inside the egg.

The class also enjoyed spinning two different eggs; one raw and one hard boiled. They had to determine which one

was which and talk about how they know. They then recorded their observations in their Chick Quest booklets.



Week 4

The lesson today was all about measurement. The class made four different kinds of measurements: volume, circumference, weight, and length. We learned about different measurement tools like a graduated cylinder and a spring scale.





Week 6




