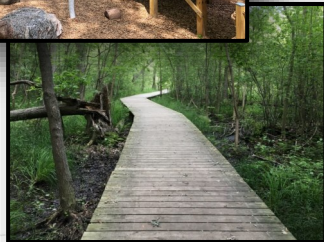

- Friday, 8/4/2023 - 11:00 AM to 8:30 PM
- Saturday, 8/5/2023 - 11:00 AM to 8:30 PM
- Sunday, 8/6/2023 - 11:00 AM to 2:30 PM



We will be using SignUp Genius again to help register volunteers for shifts across the various days of the fair as well as a Dipper Prep and Clean date on Sunday, 7/30/2023 and a Dipper shutdown date on Monday, 8/7/2023.

Each 4-H Dipper shift will be 2 hours and should consist of 4 Adults/Older Youth (8th Grade and higher) and 4 younger youth (Cloverbuds through 7th grade). Responsibilities may vary depending on shift but we would prefer to have adults and older youth handle the cash box, scoop ice cream, make shakes and malts, and help supervise the team during the shift. Younger youth can serve drinks, take orders on the iPad, and help put toppings on the sundaes.

The opening and closing shifts will have 30 minutes of time to handle the necessary tasks to either open the dipper in the morning or close down the dipper in the evening. You will see that time as part of the shift descriptions.

Clubs can sign up for shifts but we ask that the individuals that will be working the shift sign up for their times so we can learn names and know who is coming to help us work the shifts. Remember, the idea of the signups is to add flexibility to YOUR fair schedule. Pick times that will work for you and your family or you and your club and help us out! It is a great opportunity to meet other youth and adults from around the county you may not see on a regular basis.

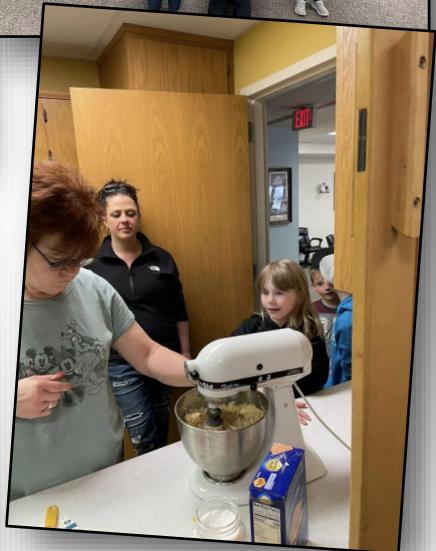

The Winnebago County Fair Association attended the 4-H All County Leader's Meeting on Tuesday, April 25 and shared the following updates for this year's fair:



1. Fair Dates are Wednesday August 2-Sunday August 6

- Pre-fair judging for non-animal projects is Monday July 31 &

Tuesday August 1

- Animal check-in is Tuesday August 1
- Mark your calendars for Sunday, August 30 for pen/stall set-up, animal safety meetings and other pre-fair set-up.
- Release of projects is Sunday, August 6 in late afternoon (specific times will be available in the Premium Book).

2. Fair Theme: "The Place to Be In 2023" Thinking about your barn or booth decorations? This theme gives clubs/projects a great chance to advertise why their club, project, barn, etc is the "place to be." (Think "The Poultry Barn is the Place to Be In 2023" or "Ridgeway 4-H Club is the Place to Be In 2023" and use your visuals to show your group/projects unique characteristics and how you have fun learning as a group.

3. Fair Tickets/Memberships All ticket prices have stayed the SAME for this year's fair. Youth Exhibitor Bands \$6/person, Fair Memberships (Weekly Passes) are \$30/person until July 15 (\$35/person after July 15) and Daily Tickets (including unlimited carnival rides) are \$12/person until August 2 (increases to \$15/person on August 2). See the "Fair Ticket Tips for Exhibitors" for more info on what types of tickets you will need to buy this year.

4. Patience with Communication We (the Fair Board of Directors) have lost more volunteers/board members again this year. Our remaining board members/volunteers are all filling multiple roles for the fair while also juggling their full-time jobs and family lives. We are working as fast as we can on all things Fair - but are falling behind. We will be working hard on our website, social media pages, Premium Book and Fair Entry Set-up in the month of May. 5. Premium Book and Fair Rule Updates:

- **Swine/Sheep & Beef Check-ins at the Fair:** In conjunction with the Meat Animal Board, we will again be doing ultrasounds of meat animals (instead of a carcass evaluation post-fair). In order to complete this in a safe and efficient manner, we are doing one species at a time for check-in. The biggest change is that **All Swine must be on the grounds and checked in by 2:00pm!**
- **Here is the check-in schedule:** - Swine 12:00noon - 2:00pm - Sheep following Swine at approximately 3:00-4:00pm - Beef following Sheep at approximately 5:00-6:00pm **We'll say it one more time - All Swine must be on the grounds and checked in by 2:00pm!** Sheep and Beef may come early (anytime after 12:00noon) but will not be weighed until their check-in time (in other words, if you bring all animals at once, sheep and beef will be allowed to be put in pens prior to their weigh-in but SWINE have to be on grounds by 2:00pm. Please plan accordingly).
- **Cloverbuds/Exploring Department 17 Changes:** Due to updates in the State Legislative Code that governs County Fairs, there have been some changes in the name and age group for Department 17 (formerly Cloverbuds/Exploring).
 - ◆ The new name is "Department 17 Fair for Beginners"
 - ◆ This Department will only be open to youth in K5-3rd Grades due to a new age cap set for this department only.
 - ◆ The Department will have 2 Divisions: **Division A "Fair Firsts" for K5 and 1st grade youth** (rainbow ribbons only - no premiums). **Division B "Fair Exploration" for 2nd and 3rd grade youth** (1st-4th place ribbons w/ premiums). These new age categories will no longer align exactly to the age categories for the 4-H Cloverbud and Exploring projects. We will send specific information out to youth enrolled in these projects with more information and help signing up for fair this year.
 - ◆ 4-H Explorers who are in 4th grade and up will now get judged in the "regular" fair departments. All Fair Departments will be open to this group of youth to allow them to show off things they "explored" in any 4-H project area this year.
- **Cultural Arts Department 18** - Our Fair Superintendent Carol Janssen did an amazing job doing a complete overhaul and update to the Cultural Arts Department this year. Youth enrolled in this project will see a lot more options and ideas for exhibits this year. More info to come!

FAIR ENTRY DEADLINE is SUNDAY, JUNE 25 at 11:59PM. Fair Entry is not open yet, it will likely be later in May before it becomes available.
