Reports of fraud have increased over recent years as scammers used the pandemic to come up with new ways to trick people into sharing their financial information. These pandemic-related scams are in addition to already existing scams, such as threatening someone with arrest by saying they owe taxes or demanding payment on an overdue loan through a wire transfer or paying the scammer using a gift card.

Monitoring your own credit report is one way to keep an eye out for signs of fraud or identity theft. Because of the pandemic, consumers can currently order a free weekly credit report online through December 31, 2023. You can request the weekly reports from https://www.annualcreditreport.com/index.action —one each from the three credit bureaus: Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. While the free weekly credit reports are only available online,

consumers can also order free annual credit reports through the mail using the official request



If you want to become a Master Gardener, or simply wish to strengthen your horticulture skills, two courses will be offered in fall 2023 by the Wisconsin Extension Horticulture Program.

Backyard Gardener Training Program (local, in person)

Growing and Caring for Plants: Foundations in Gardening (online, statewide)



Both courses teach the essentials of horticulture for you to become a more successful and well-rounded gardener. You will not only gain practical gardening skills and techniques to grow healthy plants, but also learn the science behind "why" and "how" these techniques work.
