Each year, 4-H youth are given the opportunity to create a 4-H Record Book. In the record book, youth track their activities, events, profits and losses, skill development, learning experiences, and much more. The 4-H Record Book also gives members an opportunity to reflect on their year, measure their achievements and growth, set goals, and develop plans to meet those goals. The record books can be in a scrapbook, digital, or video format.

Youth can also win achievement awards and prizes for their record book efforts! Record books that are passed on to the county level by their 4-H club leaders are then reviewed and scored by me and our 4-H Youth & Science Educator, Sarah. Scores between 27-28 will receive a County Outstanding Award. Scores between 29-30 will receive a Merit Award. We also have "Best Of" awards that include different age groups.


Youth & Science
