
### Winchester-April



### **Fair Ticket Tips for Exhibitors**

### Who Needs to Buy Fair Passes/Tickets? You do!

Anyone wishing to enter the fairgrounds Weds July 30 – Sun, Aug 3 between the hours of 9:00am and 10:00pm must have a pass or ticket/wristband. This includes exhibitors, parents, grandparents, youth organizational leaders, etc. for judging, supporting youth, food court workers, barn duty, expo monitors, etc.

### What passes/tickets are available?

Great for youth exhibitors: 4-H, FFA, SCOUT members who are coming to the fair 1 or more days between July 30-Aug 3, but are not going on the rides.  A must have for animal exhibitors (to take care of animals daily).  These bands are meant to help keep fair costs down for Exhibitor Families. Wrist bands may be purchased for SIBLINGS of exhibitors, but are not available for the general public.	Great for parents, siblings, leaders, etc. who are coming to the fair every day, but are not going on the rides.  Needed for families that are planning to camp at the fairgrounds for the week. Camping Questions? Call Steve Stark @ 920-420-5003.  Makes pass "owner" a voting member of the Fair Association – so you can vote at the Annual Meeting in December to help direct the future of the Fair (or run for a position on the Fair Board).	Purchase these if you want to go on RIDES (even if you are purchasing another pass for daily entry).  Purchase these for someone coming to the fair 1 day. (Or 3 of these for someone coming 3 days – more than that? We recommend buying a membership)  Daily tickets are not date-specific. They can only be used ONCE, but can be used for ANY day of the Fair. BUY NOW, decide your date to attend the Fair later.  Great gift for grandparents, family members or friends who want to come out to the fair to support youth!
YOUTH EXHIBITOR BANDS are usually purchased through your Club/Chapter leader in May/June. Not available online or at local stores.	How to Buy Tickets:  Check with your CLUB/CHAPTER/TROOP Leader before purchasing tickets to see if your club is doing group orders and/or if they give passes away as incentives/rewards. #### 2025 Winnebago County Fair Association Billboard Contest

All Youth Groups (4-H, FFA, Scouts, etc.) are invited to help promote this year's county fair (and win prize money!)

Prizes: 1st: \$200.00 • 2nd: \$150.00 • 3rd: \$100.00 • 4th: \$50.00

#### RULES

- Each club/group will need to supply all materials/location for billboard (stationary display of parade float allowed as substitute)
- . Each club is responsible for getting approval for placement and abide by city and /or county regulations on the placement.
- Youth members are to paint and construct these boards (recommend 4x8 board with post in ground). Leaders and adults
  are encouraged to help, but keep in mind this is a youth project.
- Your board needs to be simple and to the point. Most people will see these signs as they travel the roadways at 25-55 MPH!
   Your message needs to be conveyed in a split second of viewing.
- Boards are to be in place no sooner than June 1, 2025 and no later than July 4, 2025.
- Once your board is in place, you must take a clear picture of it, and submit to the Winnebago County Fair Association.
- · Your billboards need to be taken down after fair ends!

#### REQUIREMENTS

- Use "Carnival Lights and <u>Action Packed</u> Nights" (2025 Fair Theme)
- · Words "Winnebago County Fair" must be included on the board.
- Date: July 30th August 3rd, 2025
- Club /Group names should be in the lower right-hand corner and should be no larger than 6" letter in height.

#### JUDGING CRITERIA

- · Overall Artistic Impression
- · Creative Use of Theme
- · Lettering (make it readable)
- Attractiveness
- Neatness/Quality

#### DEADLINE

- Submit Photo of Billboard to Fair Association by July 4, 2025

- · Include: CLUB/GROUP NAME, contact person, address, phone number and location of billboard.
- · Billboards (photos) will be judged prior to Fair.
