I had the privilege of being the 4-H summer program assistant again this summer, and it was a lot of fun! I started my summer by helping lead the Yarn It Up workshop. I never knew just how many things you can do with yarn. Following that workshop was detective science, and that one was one of my favorites. Youth had the opportunity to become detectives for the day by making spy kits, dusting for fingerprints, and writing with invisible ink!

Summer camp came next, and the rain didn't stop our fun! From endless crafts to squish hiking to the laughter and songs that filled the night sky. By far, my favorite part of summer camp was seeing the crazy skits at Campfire each night and hearing the roar of laughter over the rest of the crowd.

After we got back, we jumped right into entomology. Youth got to catch and mount bugs that they found, and they got to create their own bug out of modeling clay. Clover bud camp was next, and it was a blast. Seeing the youngest 4-Hers enjoying just one opportunity this amazing program has to offer was truly unforgettable.

Just days after Cloverbud camp, I got to experience my all-time favorite workshop, which was Wizard for a Day. It was a unique experience that offered youth a lot of creativity. We worked on crafts, made potions, and created our own ties and hats to represent each house. Following that was the county fair. Fair is such a neat experience, as I got to walk

around and see all the hard work these youth put into their projects. I also got to see them have fun by attending the many 4-H mini sessions that we provide each year at the fair.

After the fair finished up, I began the process of planning for the last two workshops of the summer. These last few months have been busy, but they were so memorable!



FROM MEGHAN...

I will take action. I will persevere. I will get things done. The opportunities I had during my time serving as the Winnebago County 4-H AmeriCorps member is coming to a close. Beginning my journey in May, I had so many ideas; partnerships I wanted to explore, programs I hoped to develop. Being a recent college graduate, I wanted to use my geology skills in my position to not only share my passion for STEM, but also change the narrative surrounding 4-H and its members. My saying has always been that 4-H is more than cows, plows and sows, and I am a testament to that. The foundations built in agriculture is what made 4-H strong, but it is how it has expanded that makes it thrive.

I started my service teaching about chickens. The irony will never fail to make me laugh. I've always said I feel socially awkward around animals, and yet this is the third time I have taught about chickens and the poultry industry. While I had the opportunity to teach ChickQuest before, I chose to expand on the lesson plans I had used in the past, redesigning them to feel more interactive.

Towards the middle of my service, my programming picked up the pace drastically. From Summer Camp to teaching at the Omro Boys and Girls Club, there was always something to work on. Since I had made it a personal goal of mine to try and integrate the things I loved as a 4-Her into my service, I chose to take on a Theatre Troupe opportunity with the hopes of finding musically inclined youth who were interested in performing at the fair. I hoped that the troupe would inspire both younger and older youth to work together, and hopefully peak the interest of middle and high school youth looking for other music programs to join 4-H, since it is a challenge to keep older youth involved. The troupe began with a group of six high school students, the theatre troupe leadership team. Over the course of 5 rehearsals and 1 performance, friendships were formed. On top of that, it has enticed them enough to want to do it all again, as soon as possible, or so I've been told.

Finally, nearing the end of my service, I remembered my true goal. I wanted to use my degree. I wanted to share my love of science, especially since 4-H was where I had found this. With the release of the Minecraft movie, it was easy to see that video games were as always still popular among youth of all ages. With that in mind, I devised fast paced activities that taught about Minecraft geology. I also wanted to incorporate the new knowledge I had of paleontology, and did so by researching fossil Pokémon. Thus, an educational geologic and palaeontologic program that was threaded together with video game characters and biomes. My final program, all about Astronomy, has yet to take place, but cannot wait for it to close out my time of service.

Persevering. Taking action. Looking back, I can see just how much I pushed to get things done Obstacles that I encountered only made it feel that much more real and that what I was doing would really matter to the youth that participated. My hope and goal is that youth everywhere in Winnebago County have learned what 4-H has to offer; experience. Youth will experience passion, education, drive, determination, perseverance and taking action during their time in 4-H. If one new member joins because of my service, then it was a job well done.

It is YOUR support that allows the Dipper to run and raise funds for the youth of Winnebago County 4-H experiences, programming, and scholarships. We also get to interact with a large number of fairgoers and serve them delicious treats throughout what has been very warm days over the past few years. The great fair weather resulted in higher sales, and we raised around \$167 from our flavor of the day sales and donations on Saturday for the Educational Endowment fund with our Chocolate Chip Mint promotion. The addition of grilled cheese, chips, and vegetable trays helped offset lower ice cream sundae sales. County Line 4 H Club June 8, 2025 Meeting Minutes


Maxine H called the meeting to order. People wearing their favorite color said the pledge.

The Winnebago County Horse & Pony Horse Bowl team—Kat Skadahl, Emily Hunter, Andrea Beck, and Lilly Black—has earned the honor of representing Wisconsin at the prestigious All American Quarter Horse Congress on October 14, 2025, in Columbus, Ohio. Held at the Ohio Expo Center, the Congress is the largest single-breed horse show in the world, and this event puts our local Horse Bowl team on a national stage!

So, what exactly is Horse Bowl? Think Jeopardy!—but all about horses. This fast-paced quiz bowl challenges teams to buzz in with answers to questions about everything equine: anatomy, nutrition, reproduction, diseases, breed standards, stable management, and much more. It's a true test of teamwork, quick thinking, and deep horse knowledge.

Winnebago County supports three levels of Horse Bowl teams: Beginner (grades 3–5), Junior (grades 6–8), and Senior (grades 9–13). While all teams compete at the Wisconsin State Competition each May, only Senior teams can advance to national contests. This year marks a major milestone—our first national qualification since 2010!

Interested in joining the fun? Horse Bowl is open to new participants in all age groups. We meet weekly from mid-January through early May, and all study materials are provided. No experience is necessary—just a love of horses and a willingness to learn!


