Scholarships for Secondary Education

The Winnebago County 4-H Leaders' Association awards **up to five \$500 scholarships with a supplemental \$500 for each** (**total \$1000 ea**) to current 4-H members who are high school seniors. This includes one scholarship from the Judith Gruszynske Memorial (Oshkosh Area Community Foundation), one from the Simpson Memorial Scholarship and two from the Winnebago County 4-H Board of Directors.

Scholarship Requirements:

- 1. Student must have been a 4-H member for at least 5 years
- 2. Student must have exhibited at the fair
- 3. Student must have displayed an active leadership role
- 4. Student must graduate from high school
- 5. Student must attend College, Technical College, University, or a special education program either full time or part time
- 6. Tuition costs must be at least \$500 to receive the entire scholarship
- 7. Student must have achieved a 2.0 or higher after the first semester of study

The scholarship will be awarded after the recipient successfully completes a program of study or semester of post-high school classes. "Successfully completes" is defined as achieving a 2.0 ("C") or higher. The scholarship is non-renewable.

The program of study must be started within a year of receiving the award. For the Winnebago County 4-H Leaders Association and Simpson scholarships, the student must submit the grade report to the Extension Office within 60 days after completing the program of study or the first semester. Failure to do so in a timely manner may result in loss of scholarship funds. The recipient may also be asked for proof of program cost. Specifics for the Judith Grusyznske Memorial will be provided by the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, the scholarship fiscal

Key Award

4-H Key Award is the highest 4-H recognition you can receive! 4-H youth in 11th grade or older will be able to apply for the Key Award. **Up to three** youth will be chosen and have their name engraved on a perpetual plaque placed at the JP Coughlin Center.

Key Award Requirements:

4-H Key Award is the highest 4-H recognition you can receive. 4-H Key Award applicants must have:

- 1. Consistent 4-H growth
- 2. Be a 4-H youth in 11th grade or older
- 3. Must have completed at least 3 years of 4-H
- 4. 1 year of youth leadership
- 5. Contributed to service to their club, community, and county.

Scholarship & Key Award Applications Must Include:

- **-Resume** highlighting 4-H involvement and achievements (see enclosed sample; maximum length is 2 pages).
- -Answers to all questions (max length is 1500 words)
- -Choose and turn in 1-2 record books you have completed within the last 3 years that best represents your 4-H career.
- **-Two** reference forms completed by someone not directly related to you and sent directly to the Extension Office:
 - *4-H leader, etc. Someone who knows your 4-H involvement
 - *Individual of your choice (teacher, community leader, another 4-H leader)

Applicants will be notified of results by May 1.
